The children in the Baby Room eagerly returned to nursery after the summer break. We also welcomed some new friends.



We are delighted to announce that in April 2020, we will be launching a completely outdoor nursery at Pippins from Tuesday to Friday. Children will be immersed in nature, helping them to become resilient, healthy and independent. Forest School activities will be child lead and play based, following an EYFS curriculum. Children will experience freedom and build confidence.

Please note that Pippins will be closed from Tuesday 24 December and reopens on **Thursday 2 January 2020** after the Christmas break.

#### My Montessori Child (MMC)

Parents can access their child's individual profile page to see how their child is progressing. Activities and topics that the children have participated in can be viewed, enabling parents to be partners in their child's learning

We recommend that parents visit MMC once a week to keep up to date with everything that is happening at Pippins. This is the only way for parents to see the activities that their child has been taking part in whilst at Pippins.
